





# Message from Dr. Dawn Giakas New Jersey Eastern Star Home Administrator

Dear Eastern Star Community,

It is always a privilege to provide an update to the membership. I would like to share a summary of the recent awards and accomplishments of NJESH during 2022 as well as an overview of our admissions process. In spite of COVID-19, we have had much to celebrate.

In April, I was honored to receive the Eli Pick Facility Leadership award from the American College of Health Care Administrators. Only 3% of facilities nationwide met

the initial selection criteria. This year, fifty-seven administrators in 17 states met all eligibility requirements and were awarded the facility leadership award nationally.

In June, our Director of Nursing, Agustin Guido III, BSN, RN, CDONA, CDP received the prestigious National Nurse Leader of the Year Award from NADONA (National Association of Directors of Nursing Administration) recognizing his outstanding record of clinical and administrative excellence.

Additionally, one of our long-time staff nurses, Ella Zala, LPN, has been recognized with the Excellence in Care Award from Leading Age of NJ and Delaware. She will receive this award in person in January.

In addition to the individual awards above US News and World Report has again recognized NJESH as a Best Nursing Home in both the long-stay and short stay categories. We have also maintained our 5-star rating by the Center for Medicare and Medicaid Services.

It is very fulfilling for me and other staff members to be recognized for the quality and service that we provide at the Home. We hope that these awards and accolades will also help Eastern Star members and the general public realize the caliber of our services and attract more referrals and admissions.

Our admissions process is a two-pronged approach. We review the medical information of potential admissions to evaluate their clinical needs. Once it has been established that there is a clinical need, we must ensure that there is also financial coverage.

Long Term Care is referred to as Nursing home, custodial care, post-acute care, or institutional care which are all the same. The term "long-term care" is preferred because there is a negative connotation when people hear the term "nursing home." A person would go to a long-term care facility because they or their loved ones are no longer able to be cared for at home.



To determine if a person meets the long-term care criteria an assessment is completed to establish the level of care needed. Typically, when a person requires assistance of 50% or more in at least 3 Activities of Daily Living (ADL's), they may qualify for long term care placement. The ADL's are bathing, dressing, ambulating, transferring, medicating, and well-being.

We accept Private Pay, Medicare, and Medicaid. Long Term Care is either paid for Privately or by Medicaid if the individual qualifies. Often, people think that Medicare will cover long term care expenses, but Medicare only covers skilled

services, such as in-patient rehab for a finite amount of time if the individual meets certain criteria. A financial application must be completed and reviewed by the facility to determine if a person would pay privately at the daily room and board rate, and when a person would apply for Medicaid.

Medicaid long term care placement requires that an individual has \$2,000 or less in total assets and meets the long-term care criteria. Medicaid does not take the assets that a person has; the individual would be required to spend their assets down for the care they receive in a long-term care facility by paying privately each month. Once the funds are down to approximately \$20,000 - \$30,000 the individual would start the Medicaid application. Once Medicaid is approved, the facility bills Medicaid for the long-term care stay at the facility. Once the facility bills Medicaid, the individual's social security and/or pension checks are turned over to the facility, minus \$50 monthly for personal needs (such as salon services) which is retained by the resident.

Additionally, Medicaid requires a look-back of assets for 5 years or more. The look-back period is used to determine if any assets or property has been turned over or "gifted" to anyone. If so, Medicaid will impose a penalty. One's income level may be over the required Medicaid limit, but the individual can set up a Qualified Income Trust or QIT. The QIT is a bank account that either the social security or pension would be deposited into. Any amount that is over the income level would stay in the account and the rest would be turned over to the facility.

Thank you for your time in reading this update. We hope this information may be helpful to you or someone you know.

# Response From a 50-Year Member WOW! Journal is Read



Bro. Robert Frederick, PP shared a copy of the Star Journal with a friend, who is the Assistant State Director NJ for an organization called Bugles Across America. The organization supplies live taps for military honors at funerals and other occasions. You can visit www.buglesarossameric.org.

### THE STORY OF TAPS

Of all the military bugle calls, none is so easily organized or more render emotion than the call Tapes. The melody is both eloquent and haunting and the history of its origin is interesting and somewhat clouded in controversy.

Taps began as a revision to the original for Extinguished Lights (Lights Out) this a bugle call that was used as the final call of the day and as the name implies, it was a signal to extinguish all fires and lights. Up until the Civil War; the infantry call for Extinguished Lights was the one set down in Silas Casey's (1801-1882) Tactics, which has been borrowed from the French. The music for taps was adapted by Union General Daniel Butterfield for his brigade in July 1862.

As the story goes, General Butterfield was not pleased with the call for Extinguished Lights, feeling that the call was too formal to signal the day's end, and with the help of the brigade bugler; Oliver Wilcox Norton, wrote Taps to honor his men while in camp at Harrisons Landing, Virginia, following the Seven Days battle. These battles took place during the Peninsula Campaign of 1862. The new call sounded that night in July,1862, soon spread to other units of the Union Army and was reportedly also used by the Confederates. Taps was made an official bugle call after the war.

Why the name Taps? The most likely explanation is that the name was borrowed from a drummer's beat. The beating of a bedtime roll-call called Tattoo by the drum corps would be followed by the Drummer of the Guard beating three distinct drum taps at four count intervals for the military evolution Extinguish Lights. Following the call, three single drum strokes were beat at four count intervals. This was known as the "Drum Taps" or in common usage the soldiers "The Taps" or "Taps.

It is not clear how or why Taps became associated with funerals. However, its earliest official reference for use at military funeral ceremonies is found in U. S. Army Infantry Drill Regulations for 1891.
