





EDUCATION LOANS Respectfully Submitted By Sr. Pamela Lindson, GO

As Educational Loan Fund Coordinator, I have been given the responsibility of making sure all loans (that should be repaid are being repaid) on a monthly basis) and that all Borrowers' accounts are current with their address, telephone numbers, emails, etc.

All requests for new loans are to be made in writing and processed according to the Rules and Regulations of the Charity Foundation Educational Loan Fund requirements.

Loans are given in the amount of \$2,000.00 a year (calendar year/not school year). The Borrower may apply for up to 4 loans. If an applicant advises (at the time of the initial application) that he/she is enrolled in a 5-year program, then he/she can apply for a 5th year loan.

From May, 2018 to May, 2019, the Charity Foundation granted (13) interest-free loans to students for a total of \$26,000.00.



HAROLD B. JOHNSON, MY FATHER

My earliest, and latest, memories of my dad were of his wide-grinned laughter and his Norwegian temper. Dad was never one to cause a stir – and didn't appreciate those who did. But he could laugh as heartily as anyone I ever met when the mood was on him, and swear enthusiastically when the moment called for it (like when he tried to replace Aunt Pearl's ceiling light and it slipped & shattered on the floor into a t]housand pieces).

Dad showed his love less in words and more in actions. Whether it was working so hard on the "Big Old House" that he would come inside at night with hands trembling, or mowing his in-laws' yard religiously every week (in dress shirt & slacks), or driving me over all of South Jersey looking for junkyards that had parts for my old car, Dad was a doer. Many people have stories of how he took time to give them help when they needed it .

But one way Dad showed his love was with his voice. Everyone I know has some memory of him singing somewhere. In his younger years, he once brought an Italian tour guide to tears singing an Italian song (he didn't speak Italian, only learning enough to reproduce the song faithfully). And at my high school graduation, in a packed auditorium of a couple thousand all singing the National Anthem, only his voice carried through the air.

Dad maintained a sharp moral clarity t hroughout his life - what was proper, what wasn't. Dungarees were for working, not fashion; my wife was Samantha, never Sam. Though in his later years he did mellow, and could even surprise you with what he was starting to accept about people. As he also did when reflecting on his life, coming to appreciate the same bits of his work & life story that had once aggravated and annoyed him.

He loved travel and adventure. From a boy who rode bikes with a friend from Haddonfield all the way to Atlantic City; to a 17-yr-old soldier sent to post-War Japan (where he learned the language and even fell in love with a local girl); to later years traveling to Hawaii, Europe, the Caribbean, and more, he enjoyed seeing the world.

The Dad I knew was seldom visibly moved by much, and he didn't share deep emotion willingly. But he loved the simple wonder & pleasure of discovery, walking through one of the Smithsonian buildings during his lunch hour. Driving somewhere he had never been. Taking a metal detector to a new field or yard. He kept his evergrowing collection of treasures (some more rare, some less) his whole life and showed it off with pride when asked.

Through much of his later life he worried about losing his memory. He studied and memorized parts of the Bible, poems, and various speeches & recitations over & over to "stay sharp." When his short-term memory finally did start to leave him, that took from him something he deeply valued.

Whenever I visited him, he was always whistling, and I still hear it when I think of him. Eerily, my daughter has started whistling lately too, on her own. As I write this, she is having trouble falling asleep and I hear her whistling a soft tune now to herself, in the next room. I miss my dad, and what we once had. Some day I will see him again, and we will wash the sadness and the loss away. And we will share stories, and make music, and laugh.
