
"Well, we have a whole new year ahead of us. And







Good afternoon, Sisters and Brothers.

It is an honor to address each of you, as members of the Charity Foundation, and to report our current status to you as your President.

Though the Board has been diligent in its efforts to fulfill our mission, we find we need to adjust our budget in order to continue to support the needs of our members. Declining membership and chapters has severely impacted support for our Operational Account the monies used for emergent and monthly assistance to our members, money given to support our Home, scholarships and life skills grants, insurance, accountants, and necessary expenditures.

All Directors of the Board are Volunteers - we enjoy working on the Board, as it gives us an opportunity to live our Obligation by working for the benefit of all members of the Order, and especially those in need.

Our Educational Loan Fund is a self-supporting fund. Students begin to pay back their interest-free loans at a rate of \$40/month per loan received. For example, if a student requests and receives the limit of four (4) loans, they would repay them at a rate of \$160/month until the total amount is satisfied.

Our Scholarship Fund is running at a deficit of \$20,000 per year. Each year we give 3 scholarships, but as these are 4-year scholarships we are paying for 12 scholarships each year.

The Charity Foundation does not hold fund raising

events, so as not to be in conflict with the charitable efforts of the Most Worthy Grand Matron. Her busy calendar leaves very little time to schedule a state-wide event. Should her efforts be successful, she will be generous with the Charity Foundation, which does not receive any portion of the per capita paid by members to support the Grand Chapter and the OES Home. As our membership knows on a chapter basis, it is becoming very difficult to raise money.

The majority of our budget, 72%, goes to giving aid to our Sisters and Brothers. The remaining monies pay the required administrative costs insurance, fees to maintain our 501C3 IRS tax-exempt status, as well as cover 1/3 the cost of distribution of the Star Journal and Grand Session expenses.

While visiting a chapter fund raising event in the 37th District last month, and speaking of the Charity Foundation to its members, they graciously voted to donate the proceeds of their effort to the Charity Foundation. We appreciate all donations, regardless of the amount. We are looking for ways not to have to reduce our aid to our members. We are open to any ideas you may have. Please speak to anyone on our Board we are there with open minds and hearts. We are all members of the Charity Foundation, and we want to be able to continue be there for you.


